*Whereas*, the **Semper Fi For Life Foundation** was created to fulfill several missions of humanitarian purposes for the benefit of those in and veterans of the military services of the United States of America and their families, and

*Whereas*, those missions include providing U.S. military veterans with assistance to lead more productive lives, and

*Whereas*, those missions include ensuring that U.S. military personnel and veterans receive the best possible medical care, and

*Whereas*, the **Semper Fi For Life Foundation** recognizes that many U.S. military service men and women and veterans suffered serious injury in the course of their service to the United States of America, and

*Whereas*, those injuries include many for which future treatments and/or cures might be derived by stem cell research and treatments, and

*Whereas*, the Missouri Coalition for Lifesaving Cures is working to ensure that constitutional law in the State of Missouri will guarantee the availability of stem cell medical research and treatment, limited only to the extent of federal law and without further restriction, and

*Whereas*, the **Semper Fi For Life Foundation** asserts and affirms that such endeavors are in the best and noblest interests of those aforementioned injured military personnel and veterans,

*Now therefore be it resolved* that the **Semper Fi For Life Foundation** supports and endorses the mission and efforts of the Missouri Coalition for Lifesaving Cures and urges Missouri citizens to add their good names to the petitions to place the stem cell initiative on the Missouri ballot in November of 2006, and further urges Missouri citizens to vote in favor of such Missouri Constitutional Amendment.
